




## **QU- WORD WHEELS**

#### What you need


- One copy of the preferred pages. Choose between colour or black and white pictures.
- Scissors, a split pin/paper fastener or brad
- Pencils if using the black and white version and you want to colour


#### What to do


- 1. Colour the pictures if using black and white
- 2. Cut carefully around all three circles
- 3. Place them on top of one another, largest circle at the bottom, smallest on top
- 4. Line up the center circles and push a split pin or brad through to hold them together


#### How to use

- Turn the three 'wheels' to match the words to the pictures, reading out loud as new words are formed
- One child can choose a picture, then another child makes the correct word to match it









## **QU- WORD WHEEL**

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- 1. Cut out the three circles carefully.
- 2. Place them on top of each other, largest below, smallest on top.
- 3. Line up the 3 black circles and push a paper fastener or brad through to attach them together.
